# Flegance provides depth to Aggie offensive line

### Top prospect hopes to compete for national championship

With only one starter returning from the 1993 Texas A&M football team's offensive line, head coach R.C. Slocum needed to recruit heavily for linemen who could compete for a starting position and add depth to the team.

Enter Jason Flegance. Flegance, one of the top recruits from Texas A&M's nationally-ranked recruiting class of 1994, is a 6 foot-5 inch 310 pound lineman from St. Martinville, Louisiana.

Rated as one of the top offensive line prospects in Louisiana, Flegance was a two-time Louisiana Class 4A first-team all-state selection. He was also named to the all-district and all-academic teams, and led St. Martinville High to a 10-3 record and the quarterfinals of the 1993 state playoffs.

Coming out of high school, Flegance was recruiting by several "big-time" colleges ranging from Florida and Miami to Alabama and Texas. Being a top prospect in Louisiana, he was also pressure from friends and family to attend Louisiana State University.

"I felt a lot of pressure to stay in Louisiana," Flegance said. "I've been to a lot of LSU games, and all the state's top (football) prospects are expected to play at LSU. But I was one who didn't."

Flegance was still undecided on where he was going to attend college until his visit to Texas A&M. The fact that the A&M football team was going on probation for five years had no bearing on his decision to become an Aggie.

"When I made my visit here, I liked the people and coaches, and the atmosphere was second to none," Flegance said. "I knew

this was where I wanted to spend the next four or five years because Texas A&M is a top college program. It gets a lot of TV exposure and produces plenty of NFL players."

Flegance said with the school's upcoming move to the newly formed Big 12 conference, he can't wait to play against Colorado, Nebraska and Oklahoma every year, and hopefully, to compete for a national championship.

Joe D'Alessandris, offensive line coach for Texas A&M, said the coaching staff plans on red-shirting Flegance for his freshman year, so he can grow mentality and physically within the program.

"He has a big, massive body that in time, with maturity and work he can be a good player," D'Alessandris said. "It's going to take work on his part, but he has the skill to do it."
