"Timecop" combines action, mystery and science fiction into a reasonably well-thought out story. The plot makes sense and does

The future sequences are as artistic enough to let audiences believe what the future may be and Van Damme typically off his impressive gymnastic prowess. The fight choreography is a little too staged, but not detract much from the film's major flaw.
