

Police Beat

The following incidents were reported to the University Police Department between 8 September and 16 September:

Homeowner Theft
Dunn Hall - A green Trek 21-speed bicycle was stolen.
DeWare Field House - A royal blue backpack and its contents were stolen from the second floor of the building.
Parking Area 49 - Two cyclists were stopped for operating a bicycle without headlights. One of the subjects told an officer that he had taken the bicycle without permission. He reportedly found the bicycle on the ground near a residence hall. The individual was arrested and taken to the Brazos County Jail. The second subject was released.
Horticulture Forest Science Building - Three eight foot Ficus benjamin trees were removed from a planter near the building.
Sterling C. Evans Library - A black nylon Outdoor Products backpack containing a Sony Walkman cassette player and other assorted items was stolen from a cubicle on the third floor.
Cain Hall - An aqua 5-speed part, Carter told University Police that an imminent bicycle was what pushed stolen.
Lt. Gen. Raoul C. Sbisla Dining Center - A black Outdoor Products backpack and criticism from its contents were stolen.

Puryear prior to a football game resulted in an assault of a Puryear resident. The victim was treated at the Beutel Health Center for a laceration to the forehead that required 10 stitches to close.
TAMU Golf Course - An investigating officer responded to a report of a fight in progress between a male and female. The officer located the two subjects. There was no evidence of a physical assault, and neither subject wished to file charges.

Disorderly Conduct by Language

Fowler Hall - A group of males on the fourth floor of Fowler was shouting at a group of females on the second floor of Hughes Hall. The Residence Director requested the group to be quiet. When he returned a second time, a subject not present for the first warning verbally assaulted the Residence Director. Upon arrival of the investigating officer, the Residence Director requested that charges not be filed. The subject was told to leave the area to avoid being arrested for criminal trespassing.

Disorderly Conduct

Wellborn Road - A citation was issued to a subject who was observed exposing his genitals from the rear of a vehicle as it traveled northbound on Wellborn Road.
Clark Street and Joe Routt - A

subject was issued a citation for urinating in public.

Possession of Controlled Substance (Marijuana)/Possession or Delivery of Drug Paraphernalia

Coke Street - A cyclist was stopped for disregarding a traffic control sign at the intersection of Coke and Lubbock Streets. As the subject pulled his wallet from his pocket, the officer observed a package of Zig Zag papers. When asked about the presence of marijuana on his person, the subject handed the officer a sandwich bag containing a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana. The subject was placed under arrest. Prior to transport, a cigarette box containing a hand rolled cigarette containing a green leafy substance was removed from this person. The subject was taken to Brazos County Jail.

Evading Arrest or Detention


Spence Street - A cyclist refused to follow the instructions of a traffic officer after committing a traffic violation. The subject did not stop and fled the presence of the officer.
