# Oilers face turning point

## Houston's problems difficult to overcome

HOUSTON (AP) — The Houston Oilers have either achieved their formula for a winning season or they've started a free fall.

A 1-4 record last season led to an 11-game winning streak. Don't count on that happening again. They're off to another 1-4 start, but all the Oilers' other nightmares about this season are coming true.

Quarterback Cody Carlson is injury-prone as feared; the offensive line isn't the same without perennial Pro Bowl guard Mike Munchak; and yes, many of those fans who booed Warren Moon, wish he hadn't been traded.

"It's real simple at this point,"

quarterback Bucky Richardson said. "We can either hang our heads and give up, or we can decide to fight like hell and keep going. I'm going to keep fighting.' The offense and defense no

longer blame each other.

They've realized there are enough problems for everyone. Some players talk in cliches about concentrating harder or finding chemistry but cornerback Cris Dishman puts into words what no one has wanted to admit since the salary cap as-
