

ANN ARBOR, Mich. (AP) -Joe Marinaro remembers the day Joe Paterno came to his house.

"It was a great honor," the senior Michigan guard said. "I could easily have played for him, and probably would have ... but it came down to the facthat my heart was at Michigan." the fact

On Saturday, Paterno and No. 2 Penn State will be at Michigan's house for a game that could decide the Big Ten champion and a berth in the Rose Bowl.
