'The Student Senate passes a lot of legislation that is filed away and never looked into," Leslie said. "I'm putting a com-mittee together to follow up on the legislation, and they will

check up on it.

Jeb Jones, Student Senate representative to the Faculty Senate, said LTC was basically set up to find bills that action was not taken on by the administration or were never seen by the administration.

'Sometimes, after we pass a bill in Student Senate, we forget it has to be implemented by the administration," he said.
