"I don't know that just bese somebody out there has me doubts about what hap-ned that we should jump in nd dig people up," Snow said. Ubelaker and colleague Doug sley were approached by oth's relatives and historians think another man is ed in Booth's grave.


They think Booth escaped ure and lived another 38 rs before dying in Oklahoma

Advances in DNA testing of tissue and preserved bone help provide genetic finprints to aid in identifica-, Ubelaker said.
