er of open, local government and private property. He said the job of government is to increase the power of the private sector.

"Let Texas run Texas," Bush said. "I want the federal govern-ment to leave us alone. We know what we are doing."

Bush said Texas needs a governor to get rid of frivolous law suits that clog the courts and start filling them with criminals.

"We want people to know they are responsible for their own behavior," Bush said.

Bush said he will not allow sex offenders, murderers or car thieves out of jail on a probative sentence.

"This sends the wrong message to Texas and I will change it," Bush said. "I will show that the risks of crime out-weigh the rewards."

He criticized Gov. Ann Richards for not using all the money earned from the lottery to fund education, which is a major part of his campaign.
