er of open, local government and private property. He said the job of government is to increase the power of the private sector.

"Let Texas run Texas," Bush said. "I want the federal government to leave us alone. We know what we are doing."

Bush said Texas needs a governor to get rid of frivolous law suits that clog the courts and start filling them with criminals.

"We want people to know they are responsible for their own behavior," Bush said.

Bush said he will not allow sex offenders, murderers or car thieves out of jail on a probative sentence.

"This sends the wrong message to Texas and I will change it," Bush said. "I will show that the risks of crime outweigh the rewards."

He criticized Gov. Ann Richards for not using all the money earned from the lottery to fund education, which is a major part of his campaign.

"To reach the dream of Texas we must free teachers from the Texas Education Agency," he said. "I have proposed a plan to do just that."

"I will continue to treat Ann Richards with respect because I want the people of Texas to listen to the issues," he said. "I don't want people to have questions about who they are going to vote for."

When he mentioned welfare, the crowd laughed.

"I will fulfill my obligation to the elderly but I will have a two-year limit for able-bodied people on welfare."

Bush said he wants to be governor of Texas in 1996 because he does not want Bill Clinton to be re-elected.

"Gov. Richards will want Clinton to be re-elected," he said. "Texas better have a governor that knows Clinton should not be president. That governor will be me."

Bush told the audience this would be his last time in Bryan-College Station as a candidate.

"The next time I will be governor," he said. "This is the last trip I will make to Aggieland before you vote. I am hopeful and

optimistic about having a part of the votes in this part of the state."

He also told the audience to overlook some Democratic campaigning for office who know Texas needs and stands for.

The rally was sponsored by the Republican Party of Brazos County and the Texas chapter of College Republicans.

Chad Walter, president of the College Republicans, said he supports Bush because Richards has not been able to defend her personal attacks on Richards through the campaign.

"Bush stands for education and wants to give school system local control," Patrick Genuit, a senior marketing major and a member of the College Republicans, said. "I would like to put more publicans in the Senate House and putting more Republican governors in the state send a message to Washington."

aired an ad saying records show Furman "is a special interest lobbyist in Washington D.C. In fact, Furman was a registered foreign lobbyist for all these foreign interests," the announcer says, as the screen shows a list: Kingdom of Thailand; Government of the Yemen Arab Republic; Korean Foreign Traders Association, Embassy of Bolivia and others.

Next comes a picture of the Washington phone book, with a blowup of Furman's address and phone number superimposed on top of it.

"Hal Furman, special interest lobbyist for Texas concludes the announcer."

In Maryland, Republican Bill Brock attacked incumbent Sarbanes on the issues of tax spending.

Sarbanes responded with a harsh assessment of Brock's former career as a member of Congress from Tennessee.

The ad accused Brock of attacking Sarbanes to hide his own record.

"Fourteen years in the House and Senate in Tennessee," says the announcer. "Voted not to raise the minimum wage after one of the worst attendance records in Congress. When he did show up he voted against the start of Medicare, the Voting Rights Act and the minimum wage."
