## Cone receives AL Cy Young Award

### Royals pitcher wins despite not leading in pitching categories

NEW YORK (AP) — David Cone, coming off the worst season of his career, bounced back to again beat out former teammate Jimmy Key in a close vote Tuesday for the AL Cy Young Award.

Cone, 16-5 with a 2.94 ERA for the Kansas City Royals, won the award despite not leading the league in any pitching category. Key, 17-4 with a 3.27 ERA for the New York Yankees, led the majors in wins.

Cone received 15 of 28 first-place votes and finished with 108 points in balloting by the Baseball Writers Association of America. Key got 10 first-place votes and 96 points.

Cone struck out 132 in 23 games before the players' strike started Aug. 12. Key fanned 97 in 24 games.

Cone also started ahead of Key in the World Series. Key wound up starting and winning Game 4, then was the winner in relief in Game 6 as Toronto topped the Atlanta Braves for its first championship.

Both Cone and Key left Toronto after the 1992 season. The right-handed Cone decided to go back his hometown of Kansas City and signed a three-year, \$18 million contract with the Royals, the team he made his major league debut with in 1986; the left-handed Key got a four-year, \$17 million deal with the Yankees.

Cone struggled to an 11-14 mark, his first losing record since becoming a full-time starter in the majors. And, for the first time in four years, the power pitcher did not lead the

big leagues in strikeouts. Key went 18-6 with his soft stuff for the Yankees.

Cone, 31, lost his first decision this season, then reeled off eight straight victories. He had pitched three consecutive shutouts and gone 28 scoreless innings before he lost to Cone and the Yankees 5-2 on May 27 in Kansas City. In that game, Cone allowed five runs in the first inning, then went the rest of the way without giving up a run.

Cone, who did not have a bonus clause for the Cy Young, and the Royals were 64-51 and third in the AL Central, four games behind the Chicago White Sox.

Cone went 20-3 for the Mets in 1987 and was a two-time NL All-Star.

## Oiler offense shares blame for losses

### Different players take responsibility for Houston's dismal season

HOUSTON (AP) — Gary Brown wanted to take all the blame for the Houston Oilers' latest loss but his teammates wouldn't allow it.

Brown fumbled three times, including at the Philadelphia 2-yard line in the fourth quarter, helping the Eagles to a 21-6 victory and another nationally televised embarrassment for the Oilers, 1-6.

"I cost us the win, plain and simple," Brown said. "You can't make mistakes like that. It's the worst feeling I've had since I've been in this business."

Cornerback Cris Dishman thought the loss should have been

pinned on him because he allowed a 53-yard touchdown catch by Fred Barnett that gave the Eagles a 14-6 lead in the third quarter.

Safety Marcus Robertson said he should have made the play but Dishman would have none of that.

"No, it was my fault, Marcus was just trying to help out," Dishman said.

The offense was eager to share the blame too.

Quarterback Billy Joe Tolleriver took responsibility for Brown's fumble in the fourth quarter with the Oilers still trailing 14-6.

"It was just a miscommunication, I might have pitched the ball too high," Tolleriver said.

In the face of another embarrassing loss on prime time television, the Oilers actually played better in many areas.

"They have nothing to be ashamed of when they are giving

the effort they are giving," coach Jack Pardee said. "We played well enough to win."

It wasn't a happy homecoming for Brown, who grew up in Williamsport, Pa., and often came to Veteran's Stadium to watch the Eagles. He rushed 67 yards on 21 carries in his first game since Sept. 25.

"My ankle was not the problem, my hands were," Brown said. "I don't have any excuses. I couldn't hold onto anything."

"I don't think I was pressing but maybe I was. I'm not the type to make excuses. When I screw up, I say I screwed up. I have to try to forget about this, but it won't be easy. It was a rough night."

"I caught the ball well on the screens and swing passes," he said. "But the fumbles erase everything else. Nothing else matters. If we had scored, I believe we would have found a way to win."



## Rockets face obstacles to defend crown

### HOUSTON (AP) — Can the Houston Rockets repeat as NBA champions?

That depends.

Can all the conditions that helped them win the title repeat, too?

That's doubtful.

Those questions are among the reasons the Rockets are finding respect an elusive commodity as they begin defense of the crown they arm-wrestled away from the New York Knicks in an NBA Finals last spring dubbed "Ugly Ball."

If the Rockets repeat, one side will say they still have the luck and the best player on the planet in Hakeem Olajuwon, so no big deal. If they self-destruct, a larger group will say it almost happened last season.

Coach Rudy Tomjanovich doesn't care about the talk but he is looking for answers.

"I respect the league and I

know it's going to be tough," Tomjanovich said. "Look at last year, we started out 22-1 and late in the year, San Antonio caught up and passed us. I can't worry about what people say and do. I do know we have to get better."

The Rockets played all the parts last season from goat to hero and many stops between. That was their personality:

thrill the fans one night, send them for the exits the next.

They almost faded in the stretch before pushing back the Spurs for the Midwest Division title. They became the team from Choke City when they blew a 20-point lead to Phoenix with 10:04 to play to fall behind 0-2 in the Western Conference semifinals.

Seattle, with a better record last year than the Rockets, doesn't anticipate doling out the home court advantage to the Rockets again by losing in the first round of this year's playoffs.

Phoenix would like another shot at holding its 2-0 lead over Houston and the Knicks surely

would like to have another 3-2 lead in the NBA Finals and a hot hand from John Starks in just one of the two remaining games.

Those are some of the benchmarks that tell the Rockets it's going to be a difficult climb back to the title.

"At least people in the league respect us," forward Robert Horry said. "It's going to be extremely hard to repeat. This year, we come out as the champion Houston Rockets, so everyone will want to see how they measure up."

This year, one man — Olajuwon — is the key to a repeat. There's no doubt why Houston is known to some as "Team Hakeem" if he goes out, the Rockets go down.

"So much of what we do goes through Hakeem," guard Kenny Smith said.

Olajuwon put it all in one package last season when he became the first player in NBA history to become the league's Most Valuable Player, the NBA Defensive Player of the Year and the NBA Finals MVP, all in the same season.

He was second in the NBA in blocked shots (3.71 per game), third in scoring (27.3), fourth in rebounding (11.9). He enters the season third on the NBA blocked shots list with 2,741.

Olajuwon is glad the Rockets kept the team together.
