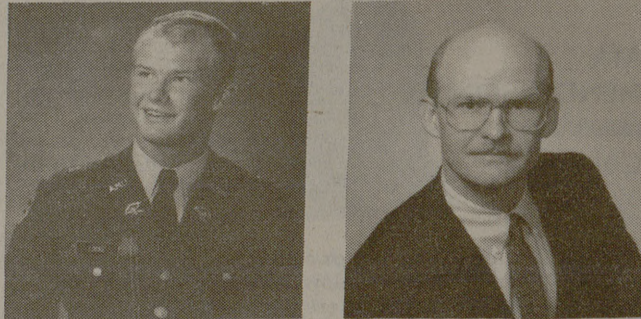

and turn to prayer, the rest will be along the lines of the rest of the world," he said. "That's not from a cult. That's organized, mainstream Catholicism."

Jon Alston, a professor of sociology, said many cults are expressing an unhappiness with the status quo.

"People are bound not to be able to catch up with change," Alston said. "They react in one of two ways. They can go back to the previous way or insist on more change. They often become vehicles for change."

Mestrovic said cynicism is apparent in the economy, as people refuse to spend and invest.

spite economic growth. "That can be seen in day-to-day matters," Mestrovic said. "Despite an economic boom, people are holding back on their money and investments. There's that pessimistic mood despite the fact that things are going well."

McIntosh said pessimism is evident in students about to graduate from college.

"Undergraduates have a lot of misgivings about their chances of being employed in jobs they find rewarding and enjoyable," McIntosh said. "Not so long ago undergraduates would leave a place like this and be optimistic. This is fairly new."

Mestrovic said people's pessimism will eventually give way to optimism.

"It definitely goes in cycles," Mestrovic said. "You saw exactly the same things at the end of the 1800s. It's social. It's just a mind set. That's a good thing to keep in mind."
