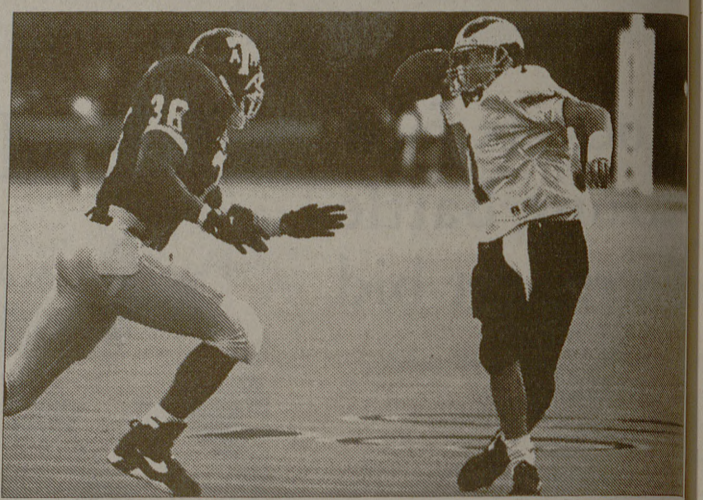

only 26 seconds to play. But Morenz showed his cannon arm once again, nailing Pinkney in a broken coverage by the Aggies for a 62-yard high-stepping score as the Longhorn faithful erupted. The crowd hit an even higher octave when Morenz hit Walker in the end zone to put UT ahead 30-29 with only 13 ticks left on the clock.

The ensuing kickoff was a skimmer that Biggens fielded and knelted on the A&M 25-yard line. A&M called timeout with seven seconds to go. Once again, Slocum and offensive

coordinator Steve Ensminger opted for a bit of razzle-dazzle to throw off the Longhorn defense. Pullig pitched a lateral out to Thomas, who rolled left, then reared back and heaved a knuckleball into the end zone.

Three Aggies and five Longhorns all leapt high for the ball with McElroy getting a fingertip on it, just before the pigskins nested itself gently into the awaiting hands of senior wide receiver Chris Sanders. The cannon exploded as the majority of the stadium dropped into an eerie silence. The Aggies kicked the extra point with all zeros on the clock for a thrilling 36-30 win.

What a way to start off the second hundred years of the greatest rivalry in college football.
