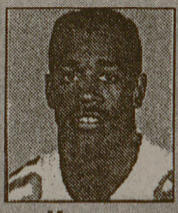

Harper to play despite injury, car accident

IRVING (AP) — Alvin Harper plans to play Sunday against the San Francisco 49ers even if the injured Dallas Cowboys wide receiver is less than 100 percent efficiency.
"My knee is feeling much better," said Harper on Wednesday after he tested his left knee ligament strain by riding a stationary bike. "I'll be in uniform and on the field Sunday during the warmups."
Harper's hard week took another twist after he left practice Wednesday. He borrowed Michael Irvin's Mercedes Benz and was in a parking lot when he said another vehicle crashed into the car he was driving. The Cowboys said Harper banged his ribs but was OK.

Before the mishap, Harper vowed he was ready for the 49ers.
Harper said "I'm going to play Sunday regardless of what the doctors say. I was hurt worse against Minnesota last year. My knee didn't swell up as much this time. There is more flexibility."
Harper has caught six touchdown passes, a career-high for him during the regular season. He got hurt in the 38-10 victory over the New York Giants when he twisted the knee trying to catch a pass.
"I'm probably 45 percent and if I can get to 50 percent, I'll scare most opponents," Harper said. "I can at least take some pressure off Irvin."
Harper, who wore a tight wrap around his knee on Tuesday, has averaged 29 yards per catch against the 49ers in the last three games.
In the past, Harper said the 49ers have rolled their coverage to double Irvin.
"They challenged me man to man and when they do that we can eat 'em up," Harper said. "This is one of those games you don't want to miss," Harper said. "Number 80 (Harper) has to be in there. I can't leave my partner in crime (Irvin) alone."
Harper said he feared a torn ligament when he fell in a tangle on a Hail Mary pass from Troy Aikman to end the first half.
"It scared me half to death," Harper said. "I was kind of in shock there for a minute."
Kevin Williams will replace Harper if he can't play against the 49ers. Rookies Cory Fleming and Willie Frazier are competing for a backup spot.
"Kevin would do a great job," Harper said. "He's a tough cookie. But nobody has to worry. I'll be in there."

Worthy to retire from NBA

INGLEWOOD, Calif. (AP) — James Worthy, the last link to the "Showtime" days of the Los Angeles Lakers, will retire Thursday.
The team said Wednesday night the retirement of the seven-time all-star and MVP of the 1988 NBA Finals will be announced at an afternoon news conference at the Forum.
Worthy, 33, started this season on the injured list because of tendonitis in his left knee and wasn't being counted on by new coach Del Harris as a prominent player.
He left the team last month when his mother died in North Carolina and he hasn't been with the Lakers since.
A 6-foot-9 forward whose swooping drives made him one of the game's most exciting players, Worthy helped lead the Lakers to three NBA championships during the 1980s.
His departure signals the breakup of one of basketball's great acts. Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Magic Johnson, Michael Cooper and Kurt Rambis have all retired. Byron Scott now plays for the Indiana Pacers. A.C. Green is with the Phoenix Suns and Pat Riley coaches the Knicks.
Worthy played all 12 of his NBA seasons with the Lakers after being the No. 1 selection in the 1982 draft out of North Carolina. He averaged 17.6 points and 5.1 rebounds in 926 career regular season games.
Worthy is retiring as the 54th leading scorer in NBA history with 16,320 points. Last season, he played in 80 games and averaged 10.2 points, 2.3 rebounds and 20 minutes per game — all career lows.
