

Texas A&M falls to ASU in Maui

LAHAINA, Hawaii (AP) — Mario Bennett was 12 for 13 from the field and scored 27 points Monday to lead Arizona State to a 103-73 victory over Texas A&M in the opening round of the Maui Invitational.

He had 19 points in the first half as Arizona State put the game away early, taking a 53-36 lead at the break. Arizona State, which shot 58 percent (41 for 71) took its biggest lead at 80-40 on follow dunk by Ron Riley with 11:28 to play.

If No. 13 Michigan wins, it would mark the first time Arizona State coach Bill Frieder faced the school he coached from 1981-89. He was forced to leave just before the 1989 NCAA tournament began when he signed to go to Arizona State.
