SWC crown shared by five

The question isn't who won the Southwest Conference title but who didn't.

Only powerhouse Texas A&M, which is on NCAA probation, Southern Methodist and Houston won't receive championship rings this year.

Texas Tech, Rice, Texas, Baylor and Texas Christian gave it their best shot, but ended up tied for the league title at 4-3. The logjam marks the first time in the SWC's 80-year history more than three teams have shared the title. It's also the first time the Cotton Bowl has had more than two league losses.

Tech (6-5) will go to the Cotton Bowl for the first time since 1939 because it has been away from the postseason game in Dallas longer than the other four co-champions. Tech becomes only the fifth SWC team to qualify for the Cotton Bowl with six regular season victories or fewer.

The Texas Longhorns entered the year as the clear favorite to win the title in the absence of the Aggies. But losses to Rice, Texas Tech and A&M dashed those hopes and left coach John Mackovic barely clinging to his job.

Rice then appeared to be in the driver's seat but lost to Baylor, which looked good until losing to Texas Tech, which could have won the league title outright if it hadn't lost to TCU. Although Tech is headed to the Cotton Bowl, TCU, Baylor and Texas have better overall records, all at 7-4. Rice, which beat Houston 31-13 on Saturday, finished 5-6.

Texas is headed to the Sun Bowl, while Baylor likely is headed to the Alamo Bowl and TCU to the Independence Bowl. Perhaps the epitome of the topsy-turvy year came on Oct. 29 when the Aggies (10-0-1, 6-0-1 SWC) suffered a tie against SMU (1-9-1, 0-6-1), the only team not to win a conference game.

With the SWC scheduled to disband after next season and the Aggies free from NCAA sanctions in 1995, it appears this may have been a one-time promotion of parity.

Continued from Pg 5 there, blanking the Oilers over the last two quarters as intermittent rain grew steady and heavier.

Having scrapped the run-and-shoot when Fisher took over two weeks ago, the suddenly run-oriented Oilers were ill-prepared to come from behind. They had lost each of their past four games by 3 points but found themselves down 24-10 after Hoard's first TD, a 1-yard run at the start of the fourth quarter.

Houston ended all doubt by fumbling in its own territory on its next two possessions, setting up a 23-yard field goal by Matt Stover and Hoard's 5-yard scoring run. Stover, who also opened the scoring with a 37-yard kick, has made 14 consecutive attempts, two away from matching Don Cockroft's team record.

Testaverde completed 15-of-28 passes for 199 yards and was helped several times by Houston penalties. Cleveland's first touchdown drive was aided by a 27-yard pass interference and an off-side call on fourth-and-2, and Hoard's 1-yard TD in the fourth quarter came after Marcus Robertson was whistled for pass interference in the end zone.

Houston's Billy Joe Tolliver was 16-of-33 for 124 yards. The Oilers' only touchdown — on a 1-yard run by Lorenzo White — was set up by Todd McNair's 44-yard kickoff return to midfield in the second quarter.
