Swimming, diving teams work for success, respect

Teams hope to gualify for NCAA championship.

It is something that every team strives for but few ever get. Respect for both Texas A&M swimming and diving teams is something that is coming with continued success.

This year both Aggie teams are ranked in the top 25 even though they lost key members to graduation last year.

"Our ultimate goal is to quali-fy people for the NCAA championships through the conference tournament," senior freestyler Brian Randall said.

The Aggies will have to go against Texas Christian on Friday while the Lady Aggies face University of Houston on Saturday in dual meets. The dual meets are structured to incorporate swimming and diving events into an overall total. "In years past we have had

to forfeit the points received for diving events because we didn have strong divers," assistant coach Jay Holmes said. "How ever, the divers have gotten better and better every year which has been a great benef to the entire program."

Diving coach Kevin Wright said the key to success at the collegiate level is the cooperation between the swimming and diving teams.

"While swimming and diving are totally different sports and are treated as such on the pm fessional level, they both go to ward the same point total a the collegiate level," Wright said. "For this reason we work well with the swim team and

support them however we can. Even with the Aggies' recent success, Texas and Southern Methodist are still the teams to beat in the Southwest Confe ence. If the Aggies are able to get past those teams, they will start to get that respect.


