# 49ers stay focused on title

## Team looks to set NFL record with fifth Super Bowl

MIAMI (AP) — The idea was simple and quite lofty: Build a champion. Build it now. Do it despite salary cap limitations. And don't slip up.

So far, so good for the San Francisco 49ers, who stand at the edge of achieving the unprecedented. If they beat San Diego on Sunday, the 49ers will be the first NFL team with five Super Bowl titles. They are 19-point favorites to get it.

With all those lofty expectations and accompanying pressures, the 49ers should be wound as tight as the laces on a football. So why are they so loose, so relaxed, so carefree?

"We're one of those teams that right at the beginning of the season, we say, 'We want to win the Super Bowl,'" running back Ricky Watters said. "That places a tremendous amount of pressure on us."

"But we want it and we like it. We respond to it," he said.

"Pressure is just something we've been dealing with all year," linebacker Ken Norton added. "Ever since the ownership put this team together and brought the type of players we have here, everyone has expected us to go all the way. That is pressure in itself."

"The pressure is part of the game and something we've been able to play with. It's been something we've been able to use to our advantage."

Everything seems to be in San Francisco's advantage this week. The NFC has won 10 straight Super Bowls, three by the 49ers. The Chargers are in their first Super Bowl, and they lost to the Niners 38-15 in December.

Nearly all the stars in this game wear 49ers red, gold and white. Steve Young, Jerry Rice, Deion Sanders for starters. Watters, Tim McDonald, Norton, too. Ricky Jackson, John Taylor, Brent Jones ... "Players like that know all about dealing with pressure," coach George Seifert said. "It behooves us to be at our best for the game. Do I have to talk a lot about it? No. Have we talked some about it? Certainly, we have."

While 12 San Francisco players, including eight offensive starters, have been to the Super Bowl, just five Chargers have gotten this far. Two of them, quarterback Stan Humphries and cornerback Darren Carrington, are starters, but neither had any kind of impact in their previous trips with other teams. The other Super Bowl veterans are line-backer Steve Hendrickson, backup quarterback Gale Gilbert and backup defensive tackle John Parrella. They also were relative nonentities in previous Super Bowl appearances.

So experience clearly is on San Francisco's

side, too. "They've been this far and most of us haven't," Chargers tackle Harry Swayne said. "But this team has been very good at taking advantage of opportunities."

Leslie O'Neal, the Chargers' Pro Bowl defensive end and their most tenured player, talk about their work ethic.

"We've worked all year to be in this position, and it was a tremendous amount of work," he said. "Now we have the opportunity to play that real big game."

"Since I came here (in 1986), this is our only complete season. The others, we left it hanging. Now, we have a chance to really make it a complete and successful season."

# Reebok proposes all-star game tour for striking players

NEW YORK (AP) — Reebok International Ltd. has offered to sponsor the proposed barnstorming tour of striking baseball players.

The union's executive board will consider the plan of the sporting goods company when it meets Jan. 31 in Washington.

"We have had over the last month-and-a-half or so very substantive, serious discussions with representatives of the players' association," Reebok spokesman Dave Fogelson said Monday.

Agents were briefed by union officials earlier this month and said all-star games of striking players would take place in different cities each weekend. The profits of these games would go to charity, and the games would compete for attention with major league games featuring replacement players.

"This would offer a viable alternative until the players return to the major league teams," Fogelson said.

Judy Heeter, the union's director of licensing, said she had received about 15 proposals from different sponsors.

"We want and the players

badly want to give the game back to the fans one way or another," Heeter said. "If we can't succeed at the bargaining table, perhaps we can do it this way."

Heeter said the union still was considering various proposals but had not made any final decisions.

"We're in some pretty serious discussions right now," she said. Currently, only 234 players on major league rosters are under contract. However, teams maintain they have the right to renew the contracts of players on their rosters who haven't signed.

"The clubs would take the position that any players under contract would not be able to play in those games," management lawyer Lou Melendez said.

In Washington, Senate Judiciary Committee spokeswoman Jeanne Lopatto said a hearing into baseball's antitrust exemption would be conducted by the panel's subcommittee on antitrust, monopolies and business rights. The subcommittee chairman is South Carolina Republican Strom Thurmond.

# Salt Lake City bids for 2002 Winter Olympics

LAUSANNE, Switzerland (AP) — Salt Lake City is already talking like a winner in the race for the 2002 Winter Olympics.

As the established front-runner, Salt Lake City is virtually certain of making the cut Tuesday when the International Olympic Committee selects four finalists from the record field of nine candidates.

The other likely finalists are Ostersund, Sweden; Quebec, and Sion, Switzerland. The winner will be selected by the full IOC in Budapest, Hungary, on June 16.

Salt Lake City is bidding for the fourth time in 30 years. Four years ago, the city narrowly lost to Nagano, Japan, for the right to host the 1998 Winter Games.

Tom Welch, heading the Salt Lake effort for the second straight time, said Monday that the city deserves to be selected this time because it has completed all the venues and projects it promised during the previous bid.

"We talked the talk in the last campaign," Welch said. "Since then, we walked the walk ... In 1991, we had great plans. In 1995, we have made these plans sporting reality."

"We have fulfilled every commitment we have made. I believe that ought to be and will be recognized by the IOC. I have every reason to believe that we will be rewarded by the IOC in June."

If Salt Lake City loses, however, Welch ruled out another bid for the 2006 Games.
