Spurs heel Chicago

Bulls suffer from loss of Pippen due to ejection

CHICAGO (AP) — Scottie Pippen threw a chair across the United Center court after getting ejected in the first half Tuesday night, and David Robinson and the San Antonio Spurs took advantage of his absence to beat the Chicago Bulls 104-102 in overtime.

Robinson made two free throws with six-tenths of a second left in regulation to send the game into overtime at 93-93. He then scored 9 of the Spurs' 11 points in the extra period, capped by his layup with 1.7 seconds to go.

Robinson scored the winning basket after going around Will Perdue to steal Jud Buechler's inbound pass. Buechler was playing for Pippen.

Chicago's Toni Kukoc missed a running 3-pointer at the buzzer. Robinson shook off 2-of-10 first-half shooting to score 30 points.

Vinny Del Negro added 20 points and Dennis Rodman

grabbed 23 rebounds for the Spurs.

Kukoc scored 28 points, but Chicago's most impressive athletic feat was Pippen's two-handed, overhead, cross-court toss of a chair after referee Joe Crawford ejected him with 2:56 left in the first half.

Crawford said Pippen tried on consecutive San Antonio possessions to get a 3-second violation called against the Spurs.

The second time, Crawford said, "He screamed, 'Three seconds!' I knew he was doing it for my benefit, so I whacked him with a 'T.' He went nuts, so I threw him out of the game."

Even more irate after being ejected, Pippen ran to the Bulls' bench area, grabbed a chair and threw it clear across the court. Though the chair didn't come close to hitting anybody, Pippen probably will be fined and suspended by the NBA.

Pippen had 7 points and the game was tied at 34 at the time of the ejection, the second in less than a month for the All-Star forward.

Pippen also has made news by calling general manager Jerry Krause a liar and demanding to be traded.

"One reason I came to A&M was because of their strength in the hurdles," sophomore hurdler Anjanette Kirkland, who finished third at last year's NCAA Championships said.

However, A&M will have to rely on more than tradition to get past SWC favorites Texas and Baylor.

"Texas and Baylor have had a lot of strong recruits come into their program over the past couple of years," said sophomore hurdler Larry Wade, who placed third in the 110-meter hurdles at last year's South-west Conference championships.

"The fact that they (Baylor and UT) have larger teams than we do makes it tough to defeat them in conference competition."

To combat these larger teams, the Aggies have had to rely on walk-ons and players from other

sports to come and in pick up the slack.

"The key to finishing higher is the extra depth provided us by walk-on runners and football players due to the scholarship limitations that we face," said Nelson, who is allotted only 12 men's scholarships and 16 women's scholarships per year.
