will have to play the best game it has ever played in order to stop San Francisco's potent offense. Leslie O'Neal and Junior Seau will have to make huge contributions. Seau had his best game in the AFC Championship game against the Pittsburgh Steelers, but he will have to have an even better game against a more productive offensive team.

• Second, the Charger offense will have to rise from the dead and put up some points in the first half. By points, I mean in denominations of sevens not threes.
