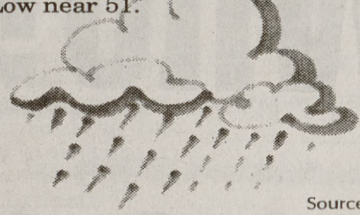
Today

Cloudy. Low near 47. Northeast winds 8-12 m.p.h.

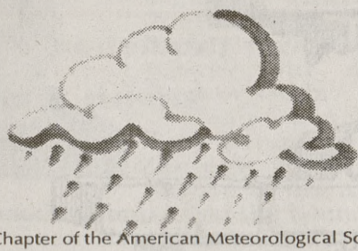


Thursday

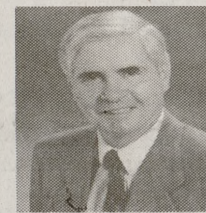
