the Aggies. From 1947 to 1953, A&M captured six of seven SWC Track and Field Championships.

Last Saturday, members of those Aggie track teams gathered

to remember their accomplishments.

"Back in those days, practically no one had a scholarship," Bonnen said. "We were out there because we had a lot of team spirit and wanted to run track for Texas A&M.

The coaches spotted a lot of the guys in physical education classes. They would see a guy that they thought had some ability and put him on the track team.

The Aggies were coached by Col. Andy Anderson and Ray

We had two very fine coaches and athletes with a lot of character," said Anderson's son Rusty. "My father had a great deal of enthusiasm for track. He was able to spot ability and work with athletes to make them better. Anderson and Putnam helped put three Aggies in the

Olympics from the 1947-'53 era. Art Harnden won a gold medal in 1948 running the first leg of the 1600-meter relay in London. High jumper Walter "Buddy" Davis captured the gold while Darrow Hooper took home a silver in the about put in 1959 in Helicilia.
