Youths accused of rustling cattle to pay for spring break condo

KINGSVILLE (AP) - Payfor a condo during spring eak was the motive for 10 ungsters accused of rustling head of cattle, their lawyer id Monday.

"They wanted to party with e money. That's all they inted, to rent a condo," said cardo Soliz of Premont, who resents all 10 defendants.

Officials say the defendants parently stole the cattle om the Santa Rosa Ranch on ree occasions dating back to anuary and sold some of the imals at a livestock auction Alice. The money was desited in a bank account in ne name of one of the youths.

"They were just kids. They eft a paper trail a mile wide nd everything pointed to

them," Soliz said.
Soliz and Assistant District
Attorney Vincent Gonzalez
said the defendants will likely nter a plea agreement that inudes \$4,000 in restitution to Robert East of Kenedy County, wner of the cattle. Some of e animals were recovered be-re being sold, Gonzalez said. The agreement likely will in-

dude probation and community Atkins service, the attorneys said. The etrib maximum penalty for cattle ngs of rustling is two years' probation.
"They don't have a criminal history and they are young,' Gonzalez said.
