

converting Legett to a male hall for the residents of Puryear and Law, the three halls had a barbecue to smooth over any harsh feelings.

"That shows the on-campus atmosphere we have here," Lyons said. "That's what unity is all about."

The award drew praise from those working with the RHA. Owen Ross, RHA president, said the award was well-deserved and credited Lyons' bid for a large part of the success. "There's no question we deserve this award," Ross said. "But for this award, presentation goes for a lot. Without

that, this couldn't have happened. I was impressed with Suzanne's work."

Ron Sasse, director of Residence Life and Housing, said the award only confirmed what his department has known for a long time.

"It's not a surprise by any means," Sasse said. "It just confirms what a pleasure it is to work with these students. We've talked to several colleagues and found out we're spoiled by the students we get to interact with."

Dr. J. Malon Southerland, vice president for student affairs, said the award reflects the work of student programs on campus.

"This only reflects that quality of student programming by the RHA and the staff is exemplary," he said. "My congratulations go to everyone involved."

Southerland said this award, along with the previous title in 1992, shows a steady quality that he sees as essential.

"I think it shows a level of consistent quality over the years," Southerland said. "That's what is important. If they won this award every 10 years, that's good, but not great. I think this shows the consistency of our programs and that's important."

Ross said he wants future RHA's to take this year's achievements one step further.

"I really hope that future RHA's will look at this and see what we've accomplished," Ross said. "Hopefully, this will motivate them to go beyond what we have accomplished and keep improving."

Lyons said the award was a benchmark for future RHA's and compared the past years to new fields with unlimited possibilities.

"This award says 'It's your job to do better if you can,'" Lyons said. "In the past, we've been standing in a field of potential, not knowing which way is north."

"Now, not only do we have a compass, but we have a path. Now, future RHA's will have to navigate that path."
