

Group discusses U.S. reliance on foreign energy

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Clinton administration, Congress and domestic energy producers agree that national security is threatened by the United States' increasing reliance on foreign oil. They can't agree what to do about it.

Last year, for the first time over half the United States' petroleum consumption came from abroad. Domestic oil production hit a 40-year low in 2005, two-thirds of the nation's energy supply is expected to come from imports.

"These facts should be disturbing to everybody. They certainly are to me," Sen. Jesse Helms, N.C., chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, said Monday as he convened a hearing on energy imports.

The domestic oil and natural gas industry wants a package of tax breaks, regulatory relief and increased access to U.S. lands with promising reserves. While many lawmakers favor at least some of those proposals, the current focus on reducing government spending may make tax breaks difficult to push through Congress.

The White House favors regulatory relief but is unlikely to offer new tax incentives to domestic production. That part because of laws requiring Congress and the administration to pay for any tax reduction or spending cut.

Instead, the administration is pushing energy conservation and renewable energy sources such as wind and solar power.

"I can tell you that we are more likely to give regulatory relief than tax proposals," Assistant Energy Secretary Stephen Tierney told the committee.

President Clinton last month accepted a Commerce Department finding that petroleum exports are threatening U.S. national security. But he declined to offer any new initiatives to domestic producers, sparking outcry from the oil industry.

"If he won't act, then Congress should," Denise Bode, president of the Independent Petroleum Association of America, told the committee.
