Attacker retried for 1993 stabbing of Seles

☐ Seles' lawyers charge Guenther Parche with attempted manslaughter.

HAMBURG, Germany (AP) — Monica Seles' lawyers charged Thursday that the man who stabbed her during a tennis match was a "politically crazed fanatic" who had it in for

The description was in a summation at a retrial that could put Guenther Parche in jail for the attack two years ago.

Parche was given a suspended sentence after his first trial for the April 1993 stabbing of Seles that has taken the former No.1 player out the embodime of competiion.

The leniency triggered an uproar, and the prosecution won a retrial. Prosecutors want a 2 year, 9 month

sentence for Parche. Parche told police after his arrest that he stabbed Seles to open the way for Steffi Graf to become the world tennis No. 1. He also said it would hurt the "evil" Serbs. Seles is an ethnic Hungarian born in Serbia, part of former Yugoslavia. She has since become

'Steffi Graf was the embodimen of the empire of good, Monika Selecthe embodiment of the empire of evil

Gerhard Strate, one of Seles' lawyers, told the Hamburg court.

'This was not the deed of a loving fan. It was the deed of a politically crazed fanatic," he said.

Strate wants Parche convicted of attempted manslaughter, which carries maximum jail term of 10 years.

That might not happen, because the prosecution is only pushing for a conviction on causing grevious bodily injury.

Why would athletes even need this money? Most athletes are on scholarship and do not have to worry about fees, travel costs and any other costs associated with scholastics and athletics. Extra money would only be used for luxury and most 19- and 20-year olds have no need for that amount of excess money. Additionally, the only benefits the players should reap are that of recognition for their school.

Another reason that players do not need to receive benefits is that they are already receiving a free education. This education should be the only incentive for collegiate players to participate in athletics.

If we were to pay college athletes, then this system should be extended to academic teams as well. This

team wins the national championship they would receive a bonus of x amount of dollars. Otherwise it would not be fair and the school would be showing favoritism. Also, it would be unfair to other students who are not on scholarship and are not being paid to study.
