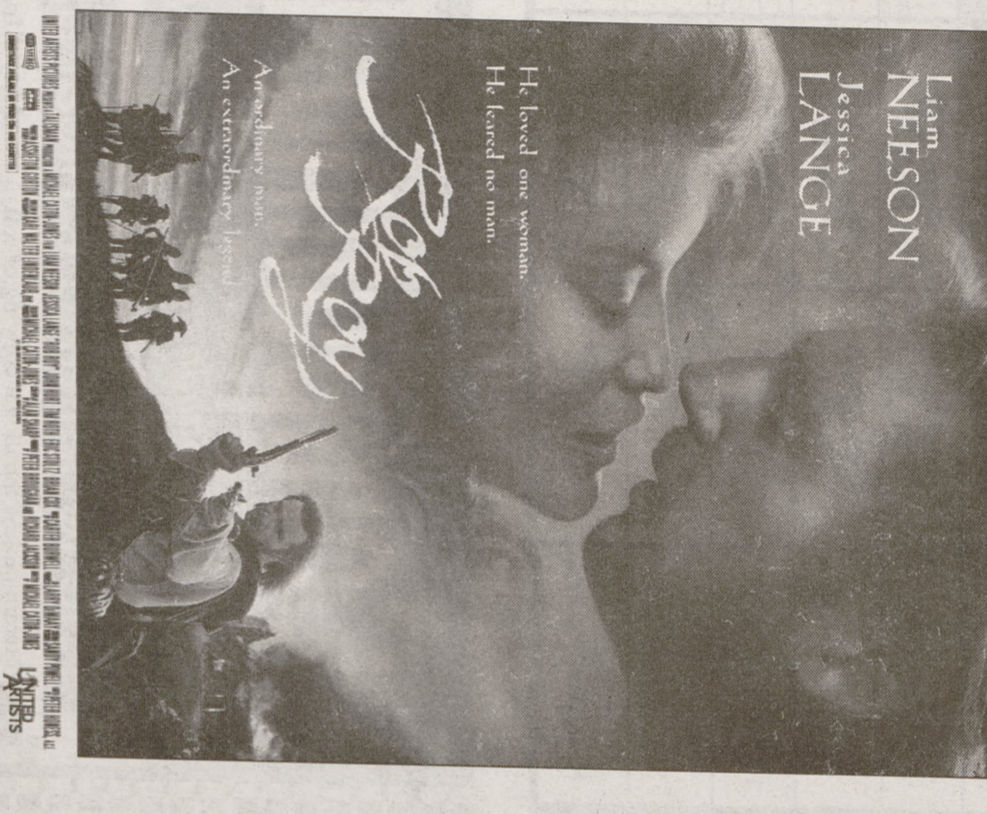

Recycling: Program awaits passage

and Monterey Tech, have more evolved programs.
DeLarios said the summer program is a big step because of the impact it will have on the local ecology.
"If you look at the current program, we only recycle 25 percent of the paper this campus produces," DeLarios said. "That means that the remaining 75 percent comes from the residence halls."

DeLarios said she also wants to expand the program to recycle more materials, but emphasized the need for more data before enlarging the program.
"Recycling is something that's on the upscale," DeLarios said. "I want this program to be campus-wide. I think we can eventually get to the point where we can recycle steel, glass, plastics, everything. But before we do anything, we need data."
DeLarios said it is important

for the campus recycling to be come self-sufficient. She said the although recycling is important, the University, budget cuts make it necessary for the recycling program to make money.
"Right now, most people at the University want to recycle," DeLarios said. "But it's hard for them to keep focused on it because it's not making money. I think recycling is good economically and ecologically. I want recycling to make money."
