# Students to vote in run-off elections

The run-off election for student body leadership positions begins today with absentee voting.

Voting will be for the positions of student body president, Residence Hall Association president, RHA vice president for operations, Class of '96 trea-surer, Class of '97 president and vice president and Class of '98 historian.
