Dollar down again, despite help from U.S. allies

□ The dollar has lost thirteen percent of its value since the first of the year.

In late New York trading, the dollar was quoted at 86.04 yen, down from 86.21 late Wednesday and at 1.3725 marks, down from 1.3785 on Tuesday.

It was hard to predict how far the dollar could decline. Any quick turnaround, they said, would require higher interest rates on the part of the Federal Reserve.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Clinton administration — this time joined by Japan, Germany and France — mounted another effort Wednesday to rescue the dollar, but financial markets shrugged it off and continued to batter the U.S. currency.

"Given the bearish market sentiment towards the dollar, this is just a license for currency speculators to make money," said Michael Evans, head of a

But since U.S. financial markets so far have taken the dollar's decline in stride, analysts said it was unlikely the Fed would feel compelled to boost interest rates an eighth time, a move that some fear could throw the nation into a recession.

The Federal Reserve and the other central banks spent about \$2 billion buying dollars, according to estimates from currency traders.

The dollar-buying on Wednesday marked the second time this week the Fed has intervened. It purchased an estimated \$1.5 billion to \$2 billion in dollars on Monday, also with little discernible impact.

GOP pushes toward passage of \$189 billion tax-cut

□ House sends measure to Senate with last night's vote.

WASHINGTON (AP) — In a final flourish for the "Contract With America," the House passed Republican tax-cut legislation Wednesday night blending a \$500-per-child tax credit with reductions long sought by business.

ate Majority Leader Bob Dole, R-Kan., with deficit-conscious Republicans in mind, elected just to rubber stamp everything House did.

The vote was 246-188 to send the measure to the Senate, where it is likely to undergo extensive revision at the hand of deficit-conscious lawmakers of both parties.

But even as Clinton was warring with Republicans over taxes, the administration reached agreement with Senate leaders on a package of \$16 billion in spending cuts in social programs. That measure faces a final vote in the Senate, as well as negotiations with the House that has approved \$17 billion in cuts.

Even so, House passage of the bill would mark an extraordinary achievement for Gingrich, R-Ga., and other Republicans promised to use their first 100 days in office to advance a conservative agenda of tax cuts and lower taxes.

Moments before the final vote, House Speaker Newt Gingrich sealed the case for passage, saying every lawmaker should ask: "In your constituents' lives, won't a little less money for government and a little more money for those families be a good thing, and isn't that what this Congress was elected to do?"

In a brief interlude as the day's debate began in the House, the Capitol's outdoor plaza was the setting for a circus performance featuring 13 elephants parading docilely around a temporary, red-carpeted ring. "We have the outer circus and the inner circus," joked Gingrich — and with that, at least, the Democrats could agree.

Clinton's alternative tax-cut proposal isn't scheduled for a vote in the House. House Leader Dick Gephardt, D-Mo., backed an alternative seeking \$31.6 billion in cuts over years — one-sixth the size of the Republican measure — and consisting of breaks for students and expanded benefits for Individual Retirement Accounts.

President Clinton, who favors a smaller tax reduction, argued the other side for the Democrats, saying the GOP's five-year, \$189 billion measure marked a return to

Passage of the tax-cut bill would send the legislation to the Senate, where — along with bills on welfare, crime, changes in the civil justice system and many other House-passed components of the "Contract With America" — it faces extensive alterations.

Although the Republican leaders during the week worked out a compromise with deficit-conscious Republicans, it wasn't until a few hours before the procedural vote that they expressed certainty that they had enough reluctant GOP rank-and-file members on board to assure their success.
