division to visit with us," Lee said. "We asked how they see the office of the vice president and the qualifications necessary for the position."

Lee took over as interim vice president for finance and administration after Robert Smith left the position.

Smith was convicted in November of soliciting gifts as a public servant while negotiating a contract for the University's campus bookstore with Barnes & Noble, Inc.

Dr. Jerry Gaston, interim vice president for finance and

administration, has said he is not seeking the permanent position, but has applied for executive vice president and provost.

Lee said the committee does not expect a large crowd at the forum, but encourages everyone interested to attend.

"I have no idea how many people are going to show up," Lee said. "We did not envision a tremendous event. As far as I know, all the members of the committee are going to be there."

"It's a terribly important position to the University. We want to be sure we provide interested individuals the opportunity to share their views."

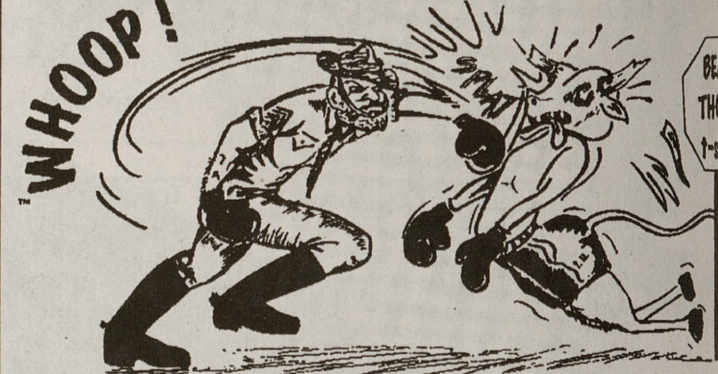
