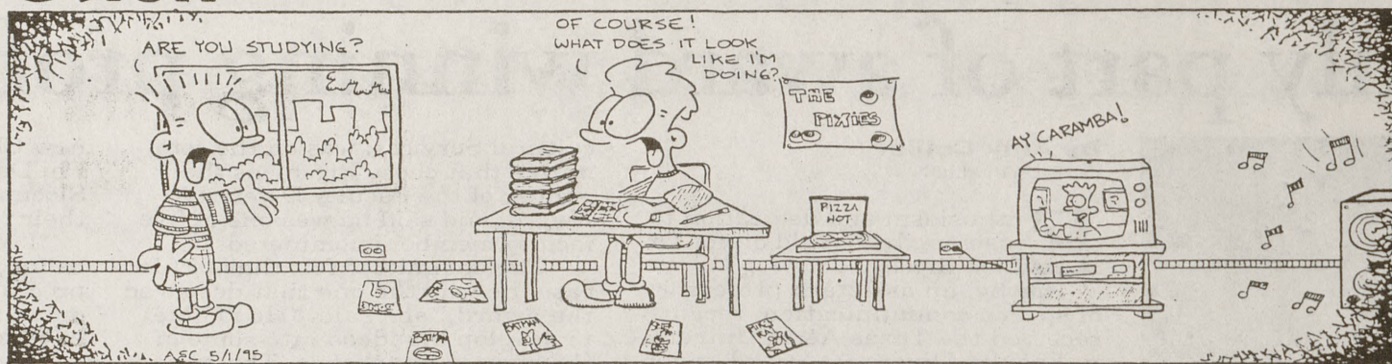

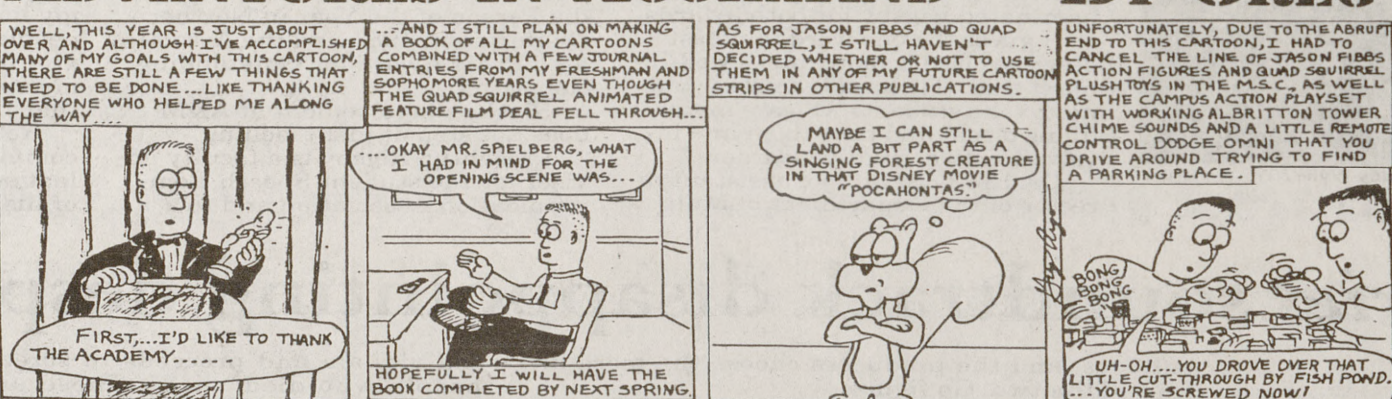

# Bad news for broccoli bashers

AUSTIN (AP) — A congressional group, recalling that former President George Bush was not a fan of broccoli, Monday urged his veto a bill that would allow cultural producers to sue who falsely disparage food products.

"Your father, President Bush, could be subject to jail time under this statute if he were to speak disparagingly about broccoli again," wrote Mary Nash Stoddard, founder of the Dallas Aspartame Consumer Safety Network.

While president, the Bush was criticized by broccoli growers for saying he didn't like eating the vegetable.

Stoddard said the bill would punish consumers who speak negatively about food additives such as cattle growth hormone or artificial sweeteners.

"We submit to you the chilling effect on speech is enormous," Stoddard wrote.

George W. Bush. "Not only ludicrous, it is also unthinkable that we could consider such for our citizens."

Bush's spokeswoman, Sarah Hughes, said Monday the bill passed by lawmakers last week was under review by the governor's staff.

"We're looking at it very fully to see that it does not in the type of lawsuits we are posed to — frivolous ones," said. Bush has pushed his civil lawsuit reforms during legislative session.

The bill on the governor's desk would make it grounds for a suit if someone deliberately tributed false information on a food product. The person would have to prove the information is false.

Backers say the measure would protect farmers and consumers from false claims that cause consumers to stop buying their products.

They say Texas cantaloupe growers suffered \$12 million losses due to unsubstantiated claims in 1991 of salmonella in their products. They also point to losses apple growers suffered from unsubstantiated claims in 1989 that apples grown in Washington state were contaminated with the substance Alar.
