The Horned Frogs are coming off an upset victory over the University of Texas in the Southwest Conference tournament and are the 10th-ranked team in the nation.

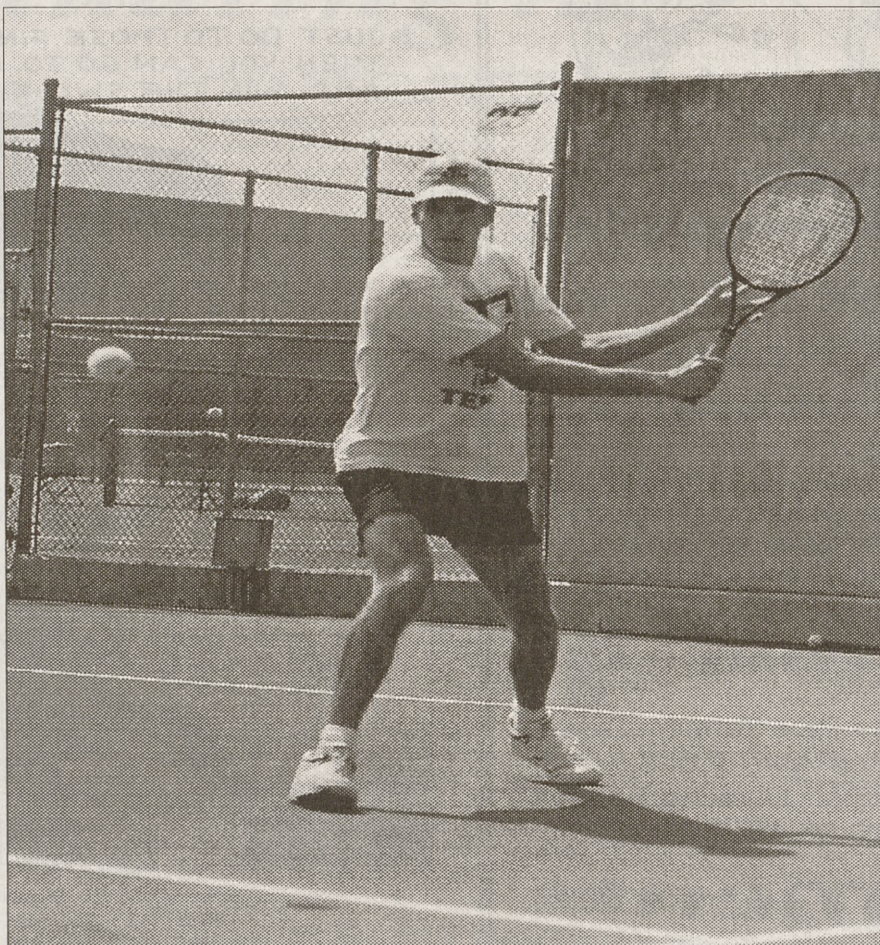
TCU is led by junior Paul Robinson, the SWC Player of the Year for the second straight year and the third-ranked singles player in the nation. The Horned Frogs have already beaten A&M twice during the season, 7-0 in Fort Worth on April 14 and 4-1 on April 23 in the second round of the SWC tournament.

Martinez made it clear that a second rematch with TCU is on the team's minds as they enter the weekend tournament.

"The whole team is looking forward to that (playing TCU)," Martinez said. "That's the best thing about this (tournament), the whole season starts over. I've never seen a team in my time here that has lost three times to any team in the same season. We don't want to lose, this is for an NCAA bid."

The dark horse in the Southwest Region is Arkansas-Little Rock, which brings a gaudy 22-3 record into post-season play. Although they have not played A&M nor TCU, UALR did defeat SWC members Southern Methodist and Rice this season.

The Aggies are expecting a large fan base to turn
