three-step process in February. A major feature of the system is the global-positioning system, which identifies the exact location of the vehicle. This information is most important when police are filing accident reports, he said.

Emergency medical personnel will also be able to use the information to get to the scene of the accident more quickly.

The officer can receive coordinates through the hand-held device and information will be directed to a database. Analysts may look at accident trends to make suggestions to improve road conditions.

Wright said work is currently being done on two 1995 Chevrolet Caprice police cars owned separately by DPS and the College Station Police Department.

The idea was first developed in 1992 by Marlin Crouse, a principal investigator with TTI, who headed the first phase of the project and developed most of the hardware for the first prototype, Wright said.

Morgan said the work in phase one was done to prove the feasibility of the concept and to show how police departments could use this technology. He said the phase also provided visibility for the project, and as a result, funding was increased.

Technocar 2000 is spon-sored and funded by the Federal Highway and Work Administration and the Texas Department of Transportation, Morgan said.

The project currently has enough funds to last through 1997, he said.

# Bryan citizens fight losing battle against egret

A flock of migratory birds have nested in a residential area on Groesbeck Street in Bryan, posing an unwanted health risk to the surrounding community.

Joe Brown, spokesman for the city of Bryan, said the rookery, or nesting ground, is occupied by possibly thousands of egrets.

In an effort to control the

birds, the city of Bryan hired a contractor to bulldoze more than 19 acres of underbrush, he said.

"The city has spent \$110,000 to control the flock," Brown said. "The money comes from the city's demolition fund, which is normally used to demolish vacant buildings.

Brown said the city is limited on how it can attack the problem. You can't kill the birds, Brown said. "So, all we can do is

modify their habitat. Several political questions have been raised concerning the money spent by the city, Brown said.

"It is unclear whose responsibility it is to handle the problem,' Brown said. "The city stepped forward and went out on its own.

Brown said Bryan citizens preferred that the money be spent elsewhere
