Confidence carries Thompson through first year

The Texas A&M chancellor reh as a flects on the past, present and future of the A&M System.

The most noticeable thing about Dr. Bar-B. Thompson is his attitude.

The Texas A&M chancellor speaks about first year at the helm of the A&M Sysm with a zeal that is confident, like an old nslinger who shoots from the hip, because knows he is the quickest gun in the West. 'I have very high expectations for myf," Thompson said when judging his permance over the last year. "I know I can rform at a higher level and I intend to. give myself an honest B+ [this year], d I think next year I'll earn an A.

"I make 25 to 30 major decisions a day, so ey're not all good ones," he said. "But most them are by far.'

Thompson became the System's 10th ancellor on Aug. 18, 1994, after retiring as est Texas A&M's president.

He entered amid a whirlwind of controverthat shuffled the leadership of both the stem and its largest school, Texas A&M.

The controversy began when Robert nith, then A&M's vice president for fince and administration, came under fire an investigation by the Texas Rangers at suggested that he solicited gifts during gotiations with Barnes and Noble Bookres, Inc. Smith was later convicted in Nomber 1994.

The System's reputation suffered another ow in January 1994, when state auditors riticized former A&M administrators like

Smith and Ross Margraves, chairman of the A&M Board of Regents, for mismanagement and unethical practices

One of Thompson's first challenges was to help the System recover from the controversy the audited created.

A year later, Thompson proudly said he always stuck to his guns, and never felt in-timidated by his job as chancellor.

"I've been a combat general — so to speak - for many years, so I was never intimidat-ed," he said. "But I was always challenged, because when I make a bad decision it impacts negatively so many people and I feel that responsibility.

Thompson said he was prepared for the scrutiny he came under as chancellor, because he entered a similar situation at West Texas A&M University.


"I've always been watched extra close," he said. "When I went to West Texas A&M, it was in absolutely the worst situation, so I've been conditioned in the crucible.'

"I was not at all resentful, nor am I today, of the scrutiny," Thompson said. "I think when you're a public official, with the responsibility I have, that's a given.

He also had to provide stability to a System that had been playing musical chairs with its top administrators. When Thompson took office, the System had had three chancellors, two chairmen of the Board of Regents and three A&M presidents in the last five years

Another challenge came during the 74th Texas legislative session last spring, when the System was at risk of losing substantial funding because of the audit controversy.

The System, led by Thompson, came out with their political guns blazing and got through the legislative scare with only a few See **THOMPSON**, Page 11


