## Football team must take advantage of title shot

National championship talk has surfaced in Aggie land before. Between the rich nostalgia and storied history of Aggie football and the great A&M teams that have graced the gridiron at Kyle Field, fans have had much to talk about.

This season is no exception as players and fans alike are boasting of national championship hopes. However, this year is different and I'll tell you why.

Since claiming its first and only national championship in 1939, 1995 marks the third time the Texas A&M football program has had a realistic shot at finishing No. 1 in the polls. This fact may be hard to believe, but it's true. Let's take a look back.

After winning the national title in 1939 with a victory over Tulane in the Sugar Bowl and a perfect 11-0 record, A&M's first legitimate chance of repeating the feat came the next season. Senior All-American fullback John Kimbrough was returning to lead an A&M team that now had the respect of national pollsters.

However, after jumping out to an 8-0 start, the Aggies would falter to rival Texas, ending a 20-game winning streak and their chance for a second title. After defeating Fordham 13-12 in their first Cotton Bowl appearance, the Aggies would finish the season ranked no. 6 by the Associated Press.

In 1941, A&M finished the season ranked ninth in the nation. But, the Aggies would go mostly unnoticed the next 13 years as they failed to garner a national ranking until a no. 14 finish in 1955.

The next season, coach Paul "Bear" Bryant put A&M football back on the map, leading his probation-stricken squad to a 9-0-1 record and a No. 5 ranking in both polls.

That paved the way for the 1957 season, A&M's last golden opportunity to win another national crown. With a No. 1 ranking, the Aggies blasted off to a 9-0 start. But tragically, the abundantly talented team would stumble. With rumors circulating that Bryant would leave A&M for the head coaching job at Alabama at season's end, the team was side-

tracked.

This did not bode well as undefeated Aggies headed to showdown with Southwest Conference rival Rice. A team void of talent, Rice was led by American quarterback King and a future All-American end; Buddy Dial.

Before a capacity crowd of 72,000 at Rice Stadium, the would pin a 7-6 upset on Aggie crushing the Aggies' national championship dreams.

In the midst of its glory, Rice would grab the national spotlight from A&M, winning SWC when the Aggies fell two weeks later to Texas. In its final conference title and sharing the crown in 1994, Rice would finish the season ranked high as No. 7 in the United International poll.

Despite running back John David Crow's Heisman Trophy winning effort, the roof had fallen on the Aggies. The team was forced to settle for a disappointing Gator Bowl berth.

After Bryant announced he would be leaving, A&M would be defeated by Tennessee 3-0 to include a disastrous collapse in season of high expectations. 9-3 Aggies finished No. 9 in the AP poll.

The 1960s and early 70s were nightmarish for Aggie teams and their fans. A&M would post one winning season in the 10 years following the disappointing 1957 season. Although Aggie coaches Gene Stallings, Elmer Ballard and Jackie Sherrill's field several respected teams the years following, none had legitimate national championship opportunities.

R.C. Slocum's 1992 squad posted a perfect 12-0 regular season climb as high as No. 3 in the that year. But a loss to Notre Dame in the Cotton Bowl and Alabama's undefeated season ruined any national title chance.

With A&M entering the season with one of its most talented groups ever, this year just the third realistic national title shot this school has ever had. Like the 1957 squad, A&M is coming off probation and an undefeated season. Also, like the team 38 years ago, the Aggies have a potential Heisman Trophy award winner in Leeland McElroy.

But today's team has to do something that the '57 team did not: Win every game. Waiting four decades will tell you, opportunities like these don't come along very often. It's time for 1995 Aggies to seize the moment.

## Slocum wary of looking past first opponent LSU

The Aggies are a 15 1/2 point favorite for Saturday's home opener.

Don't let the fact that Texas A&M is a 15 1/2 point favorite against Louisiana State fool you; Head Football Coach R.C. Slocum is expecting an all-out war.

"I can see through all the haze and this is the same team that played us even last year," Slocum said. "We lost 11 guys that signed NFL contracts last season, and they got a lot of their guys back."

Last year, the Aggies escaped LSU's "Death Valley" with an 18-13 win. The game highlight was running back Leeland McElroy's 59-yard, fourth quarter touchdown gallop that gave A&M the victory.

Slocum said the biggest difficulty his team has in preparing for the Tigers is the uncertainty of what offensive and defensive alignments LSU's new coaching staff will use.

Michigan State (where LSU's defensive coordinator coached last season) and of Vanderbilt (Coach Gerry DiNardo's team last year), Slocum said. "With video equipment we have here, there are unlimited combinations and cut-ups of tapes. It's like to find a needle in a haystack."

Last year's game was Slocum's coming-out party for this year's Lombardi Award Candidate Leeland Mitchell. In that game, Mitchell recorded eight tackles, including three sacks for losses of 30 yards.

Mitchell said he took LSU's surprise last year, even though the Tigers had recruited him out of Louisiana's Abbeville High School three years ago.

"They never really saw me as a defensive end in high school," Mitchell said. "I played linebacker and fullback in high school. Last year, some of the plays I made think it was just the case of being in the right place in the right time. Anyone can make those kind of plays if given the opportunity."
