

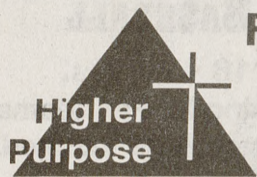

## SIPPIAL: Experience worthy of new title

like the school's small-town atmosphere.

"When I came down for my interviews, I was impressed by the students' friendliness and the good people here," he said. "I'm used to big places with my experience in the Air Force and at San Diego State, but it was always the small places I liked.

"Smaller places are always on a more personal level."

Sippial said he took the A&M position because of the personal atmosphere.

"It was the people who attracted me here," he said. "Yes, the job is good, and yes, the money is good. But more importantly, I'm here because of the people."

More than 198 people answered the search that began in October 1994. The search was started by a committee of representatives from the Physical Plant and its support areas, the Faculty Senate, the vice president of student relations office and students.

The job opening was advertised in a variety of national and local newsletters, journals and newspapers. Letters were written to some universities asking for nominations.

Dr. Robert Duce, search committee chairman, said the pool of candidates was cut down after all the applications were received.

"After we sifted through the numerous applications, we shortened the list, looked through resumes and shortened the list even more," Duce

said. "We then called [the candidates for the position] in for interviews."

Dr. Jerry Gaston, interim vice president for finance and administration, made the final decision on the position.

Gaston said Sippial's experience and background made him the right choice for the position and also led to the change in title, from director to assistant vice president of the Physical Plant.

"We are pleased to have attracted an individual of Chuck Sippial's experience and expertise to Texas A&M," he said in a press release. "The knowledge he brings to this position — coupled with the critical role that he will play in the overall operation of our campus — has led to this new title for the position."

"We feel like over time, [the offices] will save money and give [the universities] a lot of quick turnarounds in solving their problems," Thompson said.

The offices will save money in transportation and other expenses in the long run, he said.

Lindsay said the changes represent decentralization, which will help the System agencies and universities.

"It will be more service-oriented toward our System members," he said.

The second new deputy chancellor position, the deputy chancellor for academic institutions and agencies will supervise the System's nine universities and numerous research agencies like the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

Thompson said this position has not been filled, but he expects to make a decision in the next two to three weeks.

"It's kind of a combination of academic affairs and what I call a development person," he said.

"Like Lindsay, he will report to me."

In another part of the reorganization, Tami Sayko, assistant general counsel in the A&M System Office of the General Counsel, has been named counsel to the chancellor.

Terri Parker, A&M System director of communications, said Sayko will advise the chancellor on legal issues affecting the System as a whole.

"The legal office is kind of broken out with specialization," Parker said.

"She will be advising Dr. Thompson on all sorts of issues," Thompson said this position is simply a new title, as Sayko was already on the System legal staff.

"It won't involve any new people," he said. "When it all shakes out, there will be three or four positions eliminated. About \$630,000 will be saved."

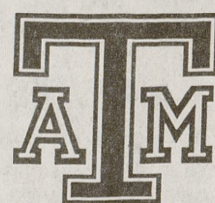
