### Booming Texas economy rises to 11th in world

According to Texas Comptroller John Sharp, he value of goods and services produced has isen to more than \$443 pillion, boosting it bove Russia.

AUSTIN (AP) - Add the pnomy to things that are bigin Texas.

State Comptroller John arp said Wednesday that if xas were its own country, it uld rank 11th among the d's largest economies.

That would put Texas ahead of sia, Korea, Mexico, Australia d Switzerland, among others. Texas is now a financial

verhouse on the internationstage, and we are playing an creasingly important role in he markets of the world,"

Sharp said.

Analyzing figures from 1993, the most recent available, the comptroller's office said the value of goods and services produced in Texas had risen to more than \$443 billion.

"This places us ahead of the huge Russian Federation, whose gross national product is \$348.5 billion, and not far behind China, whose massive economic output totals \$581 billion," Sharp said.

The United States led all nations with a gross national product of nearly \$6.4 trillion. It was followed by Japan at \$3.9 trillion, Germany at \$1.9 trillion and France at almost \$1.3 trillion.

Sharp said the state's economy, once heavily dependent on natural resources such as oil and gas, has been rapidly diversifying in recent years.

Texas exports are growing to

da, Great Britain, Japan and Taiwan. Mexico remains the state's single largest trading


The devaluation of the Mexican peso last December slowed Texas exports to that country in the first two quarters of this year. However, the state's exports to other countries have climbed, and the overall rate of Texas exporting is holding steady to last year's brisk pace, Sharp said.

The petrochemical industry has fueled much of the growth of the state's economy this year," Sharp said, while sales of computers and other electronic equipment also helped cover the collapse of the peso.

"The Texas economy is increasingly tied to the economies of other countries around the world. That's why it's such good news to see that we rank among the strongest 'nations' in other nations, including Cana- the world," Sharp said.
