Pointing to the swelling still evident on his elbow, the NFL's leading rusher said Monday he got lucky with the injury sustained in the fourth quarter of a 34-20 Dallas Cowboys victory Sunday over

"It's doing fine, believe me," Smith said. "I'll be at practice Wednesday and I'll play against the Washington

Smith, who has been hampered the last two seasons with shoulder and hamstring problems, was at Valley Ranch late Sunday night undergoing ice and pressure treatments.

"It's gone down a lot," Smith said. "I was worried there might be some bone fragments floating around in there. But there's no problem. It will be back to normal by

just a banged-up elbow to keep Smith, who had 116 yards rushing on Sunday, on the bench.

You're talking about one tough man," said offensive tackle Nate Newton. "He's a football player, a tough cus-

Smith, who has three rushing titles in five years, is off to his best start with four straight 100-yard rushing games. He has 543 yards rushing and at his current pace would finish with 2,172.




