## 76ers ink Stackhouse Cavs trade Mark Price

### Cleveland receives Washington's 1996 first-round draft pick for the guard.

CLEVELAND (AP) — Mark Price, a four-time All-Star point guard and the NBA's career leader in free throw accuracy, was traded to the Washington Bullets on Wednesday in exchange for a first-round draft pick in 1996.

The Bullets, which had the worst record in the Eastern Conference last season, had been seeking a high-profile, veteran point guard to run its talented but young frontcourt, which includes rookie Rasheed Wallace, second-year player Juwan Howard and third-year pro Chris Webber. "With the addition of Mark Price, we feel as though we have accomplished that goal and have not had to part with any of our corps of young talent," Bullets general manager John Nash said in a statement.

One of the NBA's best perimeter shooters, Price is coming off a season in which he was hampered by injuries. He broke a bone in his right wrist Jan. 14; a supportive screw was inserted during a surgery Jan. 25 at the Cleveland Clinic.

"The word to describe Jerry Stackhouse is 'ferocious,'" Philadelphia coach and general manager John Lucas said. "He's a competitor and a potential superstar."

The 21-year-old guard joins NBA veterans Vernon Maxwell and Richard Dumas in a new

"I've been on five national team trips, and this was the most fun," Wagner said. "The attitude of the kids was great. I just told them to relax, have a good time and go fast. They did all the things that were necessary. They showed so much spirit and were very motivated. The director (of the games) said he had never seen a team so fast since 1989."

In addition to his international coaching experience, Wagner has also coached some of the top national swimmers, including Olympic gold medalist Janet Evans. This experience combined with his 17 years of coaching at the national, collegiate and club levels gave the selection committee the confidence that he was the right person for the job.

"It was a combination of things," Hickey said. "A lot of good people applied, but he will bring high visibility to the program. He has proven himself both nationally and internationally."

The Lady Aggies are excited about this new opportunity and have set high goals for themselves. Their primary goal is to create a permanent space for themselves in the top five programs in the nation within the next three to four years.

"It's still early (in the recruiting season), but I have been in contact with some of the best kids in the country that are interested in coming here," Wagner said. "I think my greatest strength is that I can help improve things. This will be an opportunity for me to

prove myself right."

Wagner's coaching style is of individualism. He feels every swimmer deserves the same opportunities, as long as they work hard.

"There are 16 girls, and we are all at different levels of ability," Wagner said. "I try to give everyone as much attention as I can. The level of the athlete depends on their commitment they work hard, I will do anything I can for them."

So far, so good. Although this season has yet to begin, Wagner has been getting only positive responses from the team.

"They are really excited about every indication that I've gotten," Wagner said. "I'm pleased with all they've done. For example, they come to practice after swimming lessons, and they are all swimmers. It is an indication that they are going well."

Hickey and the rest of the Athletic Department are confident in Wagner's abilities and are looking forward to a successful future.

"We are excited and this honor for us," Hickey said. "The person who will get there as soon as possible."

Now that Wagner is a collegiate head coach, he believes the last step on the evolutionary ladder is a head coaching position on the Olympic team.

"I want to be on the Olympic staff in the year 2000," Wagner said. "If I am chosen as Olympic head coach, I know I have done a good job. I hope to go to, but it can't happen here. This is a limit of opportunity. A&M is committed to all athletic programs, and they are recognized for that."
