"A buddy of mine was also going to fly up there on one of his recruiting visits, and he told me the night before the trip about a dream he had where the plane crashed into the side of a mountain," said Greer. "So I just said 'Forget it' and decided that

A&M was the place to be."

Texas A&M Secondary Coach Larry Slade said he is glad that Greer made the decision to play college ball in College Station.

"He has all the attributes we look for in a cornerback," Slade said. "He has outstanding speed, great instincts, and he also brings some toughness

Though he had set All-Southwest Conference and All-American goals for this season and his senior year, Greer also has aspirations of joining former Aggie secondary greats like Glenn and Kevin Smith of the Dallas Cowboys.
