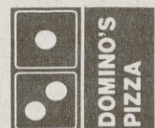

D'Andre simply wants to be D'Be

When it comes to describing A&M running back D'Andre Hardeman's running style, just two words come to mind: Speed and power.

With a 5-foot, 11-inch, 225-pound frame, Hardeman punishes opposing defenses with his physical running style and break-neck speed. The freshman out of North Shore high school has been timed running a 4.4 in the 40 yard dash, an amazing feat for a player his size.

"His biggest attribute is his ability to run north-south by mixing power and tailback speed," A&M running backs coach Ken Rucker said. "Once he gets going downhill, he's a load to bring down and if he breaks the line of scrimmage, it's hard to catch him."

"He's also a good blocker and can catch the ball, too. He's a complete player." Hardeman used those assets to his advantage in high school, rushing for 1,729 yards and 20 touchdowns on his way to earning All-American honors. Rated first-team All-USA by USA Today, Hardeman said it took a little while to adjust to the college level.

"The toughest thing I had to get used to was the speed of the game," Hardeman said.

"He has adjusted to class work and the rigorous work of college football quite well," Rucker said. "He has a good attitude and works hard. He's really been quite a pleasure so far."

Hardeman has had the opportunity to back-up and learn behind fullback Detron Smith and Heisman Trophy Award candidate Leeland McElroy, something the first-year back has taken full advantage of.

"I've learned a lot from Detron and Leeland," Hardeman said. "I watch and talk to them in practice and in games, so when I get into the game, I know what to do."

Rucker said he depends on se-

nior leadership to help along Hardeman and the Aggie backs.

"Leeland, Detron and I have done an outstanding job together with D'Andre and the younger guys," Rucker said. "They talk to him on and off the field. He relies on them, they've done a great job of it."

Although he is listed by full name on the A&M roster, Hardeman is known to his teammates and fans as "Tiki," a nickname from his father.

"My father went to Vietnam and learned that 'Tiki' meant 'one' in Vietnamese," Hardeman said. "As his first-born, I got the nickname."

Hardeman said the choice to attend A&M was an easy one. "I felt like it was the school for me," Hardeman said. "I wanted to stay in state and (A&M) is the best school in Texas. I knew I could get good education and play on a great football team here."

With a recent tradition of great running backs at A&M, Hardeman said he feels no pressure to perform at a certain level. "There's no pressure. I'm happy to be a part of that tradition," Hardeman said.

"I think Coach Sloucum and coaching staff handles the job," Rucker said. "Players are glad to be here and the tradition brings out the best in them."

A&M fans got a promising glimpse of Hardeman's potential two weeks ago in the Aggies' 52-9 victory over Tulsa. Hardeman rushed for 215 yards on three carries.

"The backs want to play anytime a young player gets into the game and has success. It really builds his confidence," Rucker said. "That was a boost for him."

Rucker said Hardeman will have every chance in the future to mature and improve. "Every year he's here, he grows in speed, strength and skill," Rucker said. "He'll just keep getting better under coach Clark's strength and conditioning program, and once he grasps the complete offensive system, the sky's the limit."
