long time and is the last of a dy-

their wits about them and age gracefully — Caray has not. Illnesses have played their part in the debilitation of Caray's performance, but his own stubbornness to leave the

booth has also been a key point. He has become an annoyance to anyone watching a Cubs' game and trying to follow the action. If he won't retire, the Cubs

need to pull the plug on him. It won't be easy to dismiss a home town hero, but it needs to be done before Caray embarrasses himself further and tarnishes his reputation as one of baseball's greatest announcers.
