going to do everything to change the fund-raising policies.

"I don't think the administration knew what it was getting into and thought a big university administration could shut us up," Brown said. "It was basically a scare tactic that didn't work."

The hearing was the best thing that could have happened to the organization because membership has increased, Brown said, and they are getting their message out to the campus.

Meanwhile, two members of College Republicans are pursuing a new strategy to obtain student feedback.



Matt Murphy, a senior economics major, and Jeff Livingston, a senior electrical engineering major, announced a proposal to find out student reactions on multiculturalism.

"Something I hate to see happening, which is happening, is that students are feeling their opinions are being misrepresented and we going to try and get a student referendum to poll the students opinion on multiculturalism," Livingston said.

In order to get the referendum passed, 10 percent of the student body must sign a petition form and the election committee chair has to approve the referendum.

The referendum is a student initiative and is not sponsored by an organization.

"I think it will work out better because the referendum doesn't need to come across as political, biased or one sided," Livingston said.

Gulf coast braces for Hurricane Opal

PENSACOLA, Fla. (AP) — Hurricane Opal raced towards the northeast Gulf Coast late Tuesday, threatening areas still recovering from Hurricane Erin with deadly 115 mph winds and heavy rain. The storm's northeast pace quickened from 11 to 21 mph within hours, meaning landfall could occur Wednesday afternoon,

rather than midnight. Panama City was the most likely target for Opal's eye, forecasters said.

"By far this is the biggest storm this year for Florida," Joe Myers, state director of the Division of Emergency Management, said late Tuesday. "It's the biggest storm for Florida since Hurricane Andrew." Residents already

weary of the busy hurricane season embarked on what has become the routine practice of boarding up their homes.

At least 10 people died and 20 were missing in Mexico after Opal passed over the Yucatan peninsula, causing flooding that drove more than 20,000 people in Campeche state from their homes.

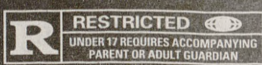

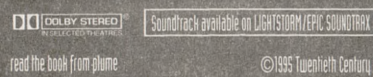
