Nash enters final SWC year with championship dreams

The team is preparing to move to the new Student Rec Center.

The time has finally come, and Texas A&M Men's Head Swimming Coach Mel Nash is ready for nothing but success.

Nash has been at A&M 16 years and is ready to boast a national championship team.

"I want to build a team that is competitive for the national championship," Nash said. "With the people we have now and with two or three years of recruits, that goal will be realistic."

When Nash arrived at A&M in 1979, the swimming program was not a top priority in the Athletic Department. However, Nash stuck with the program simply because he knew that his hard work would eventually pay off.

"Because of not having the facilities, we did not even have enough recruits to be competitive," Nash said. "But I still had fallen in love with this place, so I passed on other opportunities and decided to wait for the facilities."

The team is scheduled to move into the new natatorium located in the Student Recreation Center on Oct. 16.

Nash began his swimming career at Indiana University where he was a four-year NCAA All-American. His swimmers believe his collegiate career helps Nash to relate to any problems they may have.

"He relates his own experience with each training situation," se-

nior co-Captain Scott DeWolf said. Junior co-Captain Robb Pantano chose A&M over other schools primarily because of Nash. Pantano said Nash's commitment to his swimmers is what drew him to the program.

"Mel was a backstrokeer as well," Pantano said. "It is easier to relate to someone with similar characteristics in their personali-

ty. It was a big concern for me how personable a coach of a team was."

For as long as Nash has been a coach, he has never lost the desire, Nash said that the past 20 years, that he has been in coaching, have passed quickly and he has enjoyed helping every new freshman that has come into the program.

"It is kind of interesting," Nash said. "It's kind of a good news, bad news thing. The good news is that I see new fresh faces every year with new enthusiasm. The bad news is that I keep getting older and I don't understand their music anymore."

During Nash's career at A&M, 38 A&M swimmers have earned a total of 84 All-American awards. In 1985, the women's squad produced seven All-Americans and finished 11th at the NCAA Championships.

This year, for the first time since Nash has been at A&M, both the men's and women's teams will have separate coaches.

"At this point in time my career, at A&M has had some changes," Nash said. "The new facility will be a tremendous boost, and because of the separation of the programs it will be a different job than before. Don (Wagner) as the women's coach has a different way to do things."

Nash doesn't see himself anywhere but at A&M in the near future.

"I'm in a situation now where as a coach I am the most comfortable. I am shooting for an increased percentage of international and national awards. We have more kids this fall that are blue chips than in five years."
