The time has finally come, and Texas A&M Men's Head Swimming Coach Mel Nash is ready for nothing but success

Nash has been at A&M for 16 years and is ready to boast a national championship team.

"I want to build a team that is competitive for the national championship," Nash said. "With the people we have now and with two or three years of recruits, that goal will be realistic.

When Nash arrived at A&M in 1979, the swimming program was not a top priority in the Athletic Department. However, Nash stuck with the program simply because he knew that his hard work would eventually pay off.

"Because of not having the facilities, we did not even have enough recruits to be competitive," Nash said. "But I still had fallen in love with this place, so I passed on other opportunities and decided to wait for the facilities.'

The team is scheduled to move into the new natatorium located in the Student Recreation Center on Oct. 16.

Nash began his swimming career at Indiana University where he was a four-year NCAA All-American. His swimmers believe his collegiate career helps Nash to relate to any problems they may have.


