Texans to participate in Million Man March

□ The controversial march on Washington was begun by **Nation of Islam leader Louis** Ferrakhan.

DALLAS (AP) - The Rev. Derrick Harkins is excited about being among the black men from around the country planning to fill Washington on Monday for a peaceful protest against the negative stereotypes they constantly face.

But for the Million Man March to have a lasting impact, Harkins said, the participants must bring the momentum and lessons of the gathering back home so they can continue working towards those goals every day.

"The hope of the Dallas Organizing Committee, as well as all of those who are committed to this march, is that we will return to our communities with a sense of collective strength and resolve," said Harkins, making the trip this weekend.
