DALLAS (AP) — The Rev. Derrick Harkins is excited about being among the black men from around the country planning to fill Washington on Monday for a peaceful protest against the negative stereotypes they constantly face. But for the Million Man March to have a lasting impact, Harkins said, the participants must bring the momentum and lessons of the gathering back home so they can continue working towards those goals every day. "The hope of the Dallas Organizing Committee, as well as all of those who are committed to this march, is that we will return to our communities with a sense of collective

making the trip this weekend. McLennan County Commissioner Lee Gibson said he expects about 500 people from the Waco, Killen and Temple areas also join the march. The Million Man March is the brainchild of Nation of Islam leader Louis Farrakhan. His goal is to bring positive publicity to the marginalized black male through the visual image of a large number of black men who go to school, work hard and care for their families. It also is described as a call for black men to come together to end the inner-city epidemic of crime, drugs and unemployment, the conditions that feed media images of black men. "It's time to turn to us and for us to take leadership role we should've taken a long time ago," Gibson said. Because this march is sponsored by controversial and often alienating Farrakhan, many blacks are against it. March supporters said they hope people put aside their political and spiritual differences in support of a greater cause.
