Cowboys ground Chargers

Dallas ran its record to 6-1 this season although Emmitt Smith was held under 100 yards.

SAN DIEGO (AP) — Gale Gilbert's shot at glory kept ending up in the hands of the Dallas Cowboys.

The career backup quarterback had a miserable day in relief of the injured Stan Humphries, ending San Diego's first four drives with turnovers, including three interceptions. Two of them set up touchdown runs by Emmitt Smith as the Cowboys beat the Chargers 23-9 on Sunday.

Smith, the NFL's leading rusher, was held under 100 yards for the second time in three games, but it hardly mattered. He finished with a season-low 68 yards on 22 carries, and set the club

record for career touchdowns with 88. He had been tied with Tony Dorsett at 86.

Troy Aikman recovered from a safety on Dallas' first play from scrimmage and had an outstanding day, completing 21 of 30 passes — including his first 11 — for 222 yards and no interceptions. Michael Irvin had seven receptions for 103 yards, his team-record fifth straight 100-yard game.

Larry Brown, Brock Marion and Clayton Holmes had interceptions, and Shante Carver had a fumble recovery and two sacks for Dallas (6-1).

Gilbert, making only the fourth start of his 10-year career,

was 20 of 32 for 206 yards on three interceptions and six sacks. Charles Haley and Carver had two sacks apiece.

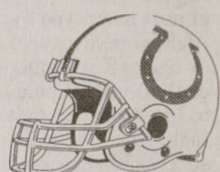
The defending AFC champion Chargers (3-4) are on their third three-game losing streak since early in the 1993 season.

Dallas, the NFL's top offense, capitalized on the turnovers and led 14-0 at halftime. San Diego got into it with Ronnie Harmon's 48-yard touchdown run on counter play in the third quarter, making it 14-9. Harmon slipped a tackle by Darnell Woodson and had San Diego's longest run in nearly two weeks.

Colts pull second shocker in two weeks

The 49ers missed a 46-yard field goal with 50 seconds left that would have won the game.

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — Cary Blanchard's fourth field goal, a 41-yarder with 2:36 left, lifted the Indianapolis Colts to an 18-17 victory over the 49ers. San Francisco (4-2) missed a chance to go ahead with 50 seconds left when Doug Brien's 46-yard field goal attempt went wide right.

Earlier this season, the Colts (4-2) rallied from 21-point

deficits to beat the New York Jets and Miami Dolphins.

It was the third straight upset for the Colts, who also surprised then-undefeated St. Louis and Miami the previous two weeks. It also was the first time since 1973 the Colts beat a defending Super Bowl champion.

The 49ers led 17-15 on a career-long 51-yard field goal by Brien midway through the fourth quarter, but a 33-yard reception by Ken Dilger on the next series help set up Blanchard's winning kick.

San Francisco reached the Indianapolis 28 with 50 seconds to go, but Brien's kick missed and the Colts ran out
