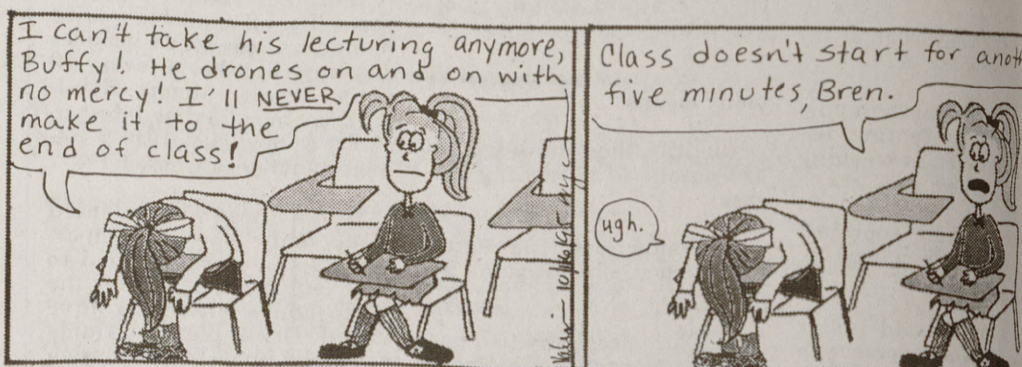

Friday, October 27, Wehner 159, 7:30-9:00 p.m.

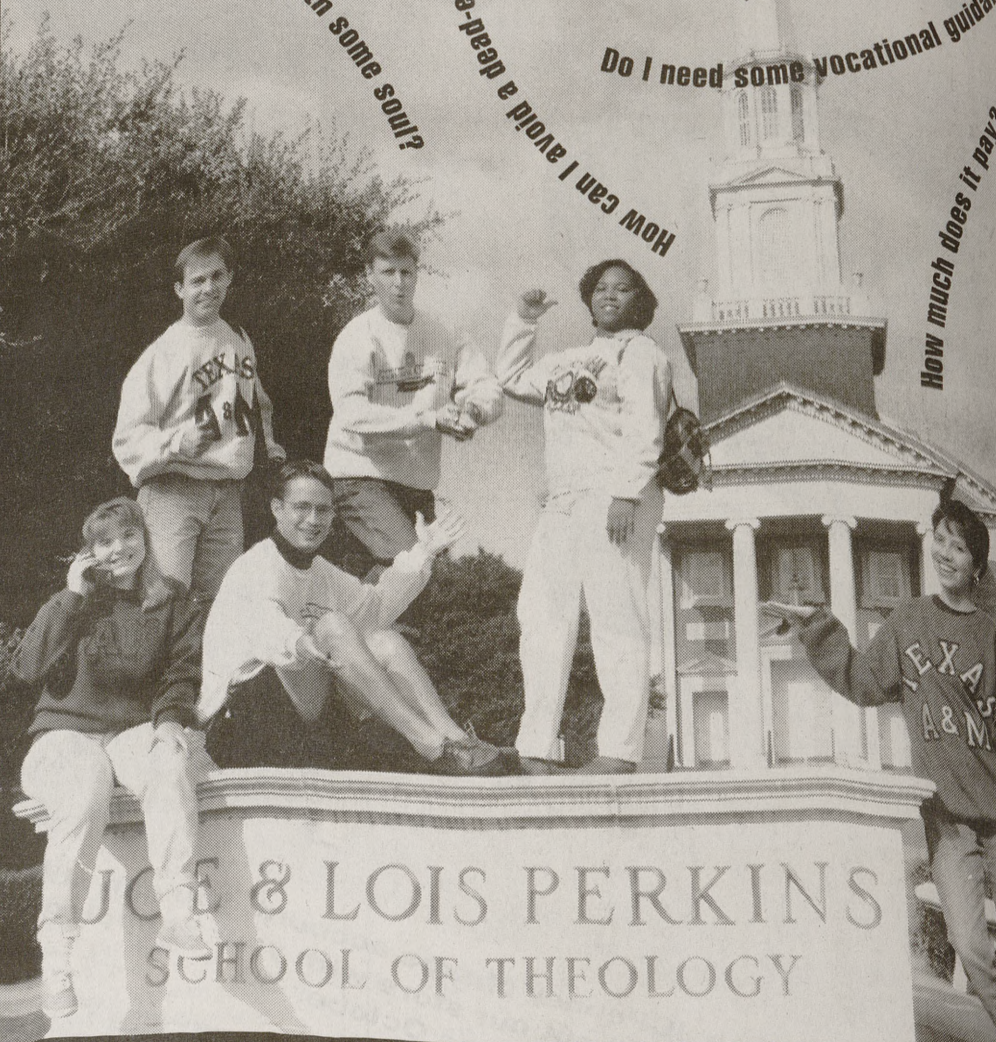
