

In the last regular season home game of their careers, seniors Corie Hammers, Amanda Malburg, and Carrie Wheeler went out in style on Sunday afternoon as the Texas A&M soccer team pounded Stephen F. Austin State University 10-0 at the Aggie Soccer Complex.

After being honored with roses before the game from their coaches and teammates, Hammers and Malburg brightened an already special day by scoring their first goals of the season during the match. Of course, just about everyone got on the board in this rout of the outgunned and overmatched Lady Jacks.

Hammers gave the Lady Aggies the early lead in the game's 16th minute when she zipped an easy shot past the outstretched SFA goalkeeper. Sophomore forward Bryn Blalack increased the A&M lead to 2-0 with her 19th goal of the season on a breakaway seven minutes later. Freshman forward Nicole Shook scored the first of her three goals with just under seven minutes to play in the first half. Freshman midfielder Misty Trujillo closed out the first half A&M of domination

with her first goal of the season to bring the halftime score to 4-0. Unfortunately for the Lady Jacks, the second half proved to be even worse, as A&M scored six more goals for the easy win.

The player of the game for A&M was Shook, who grabbed her first career hat trick and tied the team record for assists in a game with three. Shook was all smiles after the game and credited her outstanding scoring day to the combined efforts of her fellow
