A&M heads for the mountains

□ The Lady Aggies are coming off a 3-0 sweep of the Lady Cougars.

The No.19 Texas A&M Volleyball team will travel to Utah this weekend to face No.23 Brigham Young and the Utah Utes.

Tonight the Lady Aggies will be in Provo to play the BYU Cougars at 8:30 p.m. They will then travel to Salt Lake City to face the Utah Utes at 8:00 p.m. Saturday.

Brigham Young is 11-9 overall and is ranked 23rd in the nation. As a team the Cougars are hitting .192 and are averaging 15.04 kills, 16.07 digs, and 3.53 blocks per game while holding their opponents to a .135 hitting percentage, 13.21 kill average and 15.26 digs and 2.48 blocks per game.

The Cougars are led by 6-1 middle blocker Amy Steele who averages a team high 1.69 blocks, .277 hitting percentage and 3.9 kills per game.

The Utah Utes are led by Amanda Van Schalkwyk who leads the Utes team with a .258 hitting efficiency and 1.27 blocks per game. The Utes are hitting .192 and averaging 15.13 kills, 14.79 digs and 2.74 blocks per game.

The Lady Aggies improved their record to 15-4, 6-1 after defeating the University of Houston Cougars (15-12, 15-12, 15-8) Wednesday night at G. Rollie White Coliseum. The Lady Aggies are second in the Southwest Conference behind No.8 Texas but will have a chance to tie for the lead with a win over the Longhorns on Nov. 6.

Outside hitter Andrea Williams and middle blocker Page White lead the SWC in hitting efficiency with .315 and .311 marks, respectively. Middle blocker Cindy VanderWoude is ranked fourth in the SWC with a .295 hitting percentage in all matches played and leads the SWC in conference matches only with a .424 hitting percentage.

The Lady Aggies lead the league in hitting efficiency (.286), kills per game (18.86) and assists per game (16.95).

New week, different... The Virtual Texas Aggie Football Team continues to march toward destiny. Today, throttling the University of Houston 56-27 at the Field thanks in large part to linebacker Trent Driver, seldom-used tight end Clay.

Driver, who has had found playing time elusive this season, recorded four against Cougar quarterbacks Chuck Clements, and a punt, which he recovered the end zone for a touchdown.

Clay, who has never more than two passes in a game this season, hauled seven for 166 yards and a touchdown against a very tough Cougar defense.

Danny McCray, who is coming off the greatest performance by a receiver in Aggie football history, kept his man Trophy hopes alive.

The junior caught six passes for 200 yards and scored three touchdowns.

For his part, junior tailback Leeland McElroy kept his in the Heisman race, with 158 yards on 13 carries and scoring two touchdowns.

In all, the Aggies outplayed UH 553-296, holding the Cougars to a horrendous yards rushing, the "Wreck Crew" second straight performance.

lead."

As the team's top runner, Etchberger feels some pressure to perform at a high level. However, she said any heat she feels is due to the expectations she places on herself.

"I put most pressure on myself," Etchberger said. "I set high goals and only expect the best of myself. I don't feel it from anyone else."

"She's very conscientious

of how people perceive her," Hinze said. "She tries not to come off as too standoffish and her teammates really admire her."

For all her success in running, Etchberger said there are several variables that can aid her cause in meets. For instance, weather can have an influence on her results.

"I love cold weather," Etchberger said. "A lot of people don't like it, but I've had some of my best meets in cold weather."

On Monday, Etchberger and the cross country team will compete in the Southwest Conference Champi-

onships at Western Oaks Country Club in Waco. In 1994, Etchberger placed sixth at the Championships and will contend again in this, her final season, for an All-SWC medal.

"It's no big secret that she's one of my favorite runners on the team, and I wish for her to go out with all the accolades and honors that she can possibly earn," Hinze said.

"It would mean a great deal to me (winning a medal)," Etchberger said. "I've worked hard the past four years and it would be a nice ending to my collegiate cross country career."

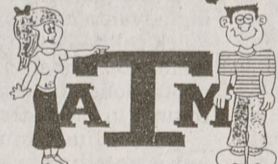

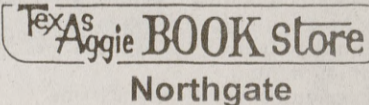
